

Farewell Message

As most of you should now by now, Fred Croydon will be taking over as President of the North Cascades Corvairs car club in February, so this will be my last column. Once again, I ask all NCC members to join with me in wishing Fred and the other new officers all the best as our club moves on.

But some things never seem to change. A review of my column from last February reveals a deep disagreement in the Corvair community on how best to ensure the future of CORSA. Unfortunately, it seems to me that over the last year the disagreement has become more bitter and in some cases, personal. I have shared my thoughts about CORSA with some of you on this, and frankly those feelings played a large part in my decision to step down as NCC president.

Last week I received a disturbing message from Galen Laird about the Corvair Gathering. It is increasingly looking like Hinton Chevrolet will no longer support the show. A final decision on the show's fate will be made on February 4th, but Galen has cautioned me that it does not look promising.

Shifting gears to some more positive news, Jeff has once again updated and improved the usability of the NCC website. He has added several new links and by categorizing them made the links page more user friendly. An Automobilia category has been added to include non-Corvair sites like the Snap-On tool site pictured on the cover. The short story on how that came about is that the owner of the site contacted us because of the interesting story he read about NCC on *our website*. It is my belief that if the Corvair hobby wants to remain viable in the long term, we need a more visible presence in the collector car world. Sadly, (see paragraph 2 above) I feel that is not taking place.

Continuing the good news on Page 5 we have an interesting story from Terry Beneze about an unexpected Corvair acquisition. You never know where a classic Corvair will turn up!

It was one of those coincidental finds. We were out for breakfast at a place in Chelan last summer. One of our friends had seen us the day before driving our V8 Corvair. It jogged his memory that he knew someone who had this 1964 Spyder. This man had purchased 130 acres outside of Chelan and found almost 50 cars and one airplane on the land. The 90 year old former owner had died and his family in California came and took the airplane but had no interest in the mostly 1970's era cars. This car was selected for a restoration, but the new owner got distracted with a 1968 Ford convertible and lost interest. When we went to look at the car after breakfast (immediately after!) we found an almost complete car that had been sitting since 1993...as long as our V8 car had sat!

Amazingly, the car was intact. All the Spyder and Turbo emblems were there. All the parts were there except the turbo, which I have since bought another. The engine is a correct year YR which I believe is the original. All the gauges and chrome and everything was there! So we bought it on the spot and had it hauled home.

Now we had 3 Corvairs. So we had a 30 x 30 garage built which we christened the Cor-age to hold and restore all these great cars! Of course, the 1964 has some rust but not as bad as I would have expected. I bought an entire set of new replacement floor pans for \$40! It needed tires as all four where different size rims and worn out tires. So I had 4 rims powder-coated and B.F. Goodrich radial wide whites installed so it would roll easy. The garage (Cor-age) has just been completed and hopefully the insulation and drywall (and heater!) will be installed before the end of the month so I can get going on painting the other two cars and fixing the rust and painting this one.

We removed all the emblems and chrome and spent an entire weekend polishing. It doesn't show in the photos, but we have both bumpers in great shape with spares for each end. The trunk was packed with spare parts like rubber parts contained within a tupperware with a little bit of oil to keep things moist. Brand new window fuzzys, brand new headers (for sale) and mufflers, wrapped up door panels and vi-

sors and that kind of stuff. In the passenger compartment we found boxes and boxes of old CORSA stuff and papers indicating the previous owner had been very active in a Corvair Club in Minnesota. Lots or auto cross stuff, too. Most were thrown away due to moisture damage, but I spent a whole day reading it and recording names and dates. Very interesting.

I think it will be good to resurrect this machine. We're pretty excited about the Spyder. And hopefully, it will be up and running by summer and Claudia will join me in bringing it to a run one weekend.

CORSA CORNER

There has been a lot of talk lately about increasing CORSA membership and the future of CORSA, so I began to formulate a membership concept and a plan for the future, using ideas from many members. This is a quick overview of the end result. If you are interested in the complete plan, you can contact me at iteration.com and I will send you a copy.

Here is the first piece of the plan. As a CORSA member and Central Director I would like to be able to communicate and provide valuable services to as many people as possible. These services need to be paid for. This has been done two ways in the past, by members paying CORSA dues, and for chapters that don't have 100% CORSA membership, a chapters filing fee. The dues have been rising to offset the cost of services, but the filing fee has not. The fee is small and fixed, so it does not cover the CORSA provided services, mostly administration and insurance fees, for all of the non-CORSA members in some chapters. This has been a point of contention for many years, but I believe all members, CORSA and chapter members alike want to do their part and pay for the services they receive. There are three obvious ways to solve this problem. Raise the dues, change the filing fee to a per person fee, or mandate 100% CORSA membership from chapters. A better solution would be if we added more value to CORSA membership by adding a choice of three separately priced membership levels, and more services. Here is a short description of the membership tiers and the added services.

Tier 1 should be priced to make it cost effective for those who wish to participate in CORSA events, pay for their portion of CORSA insurance and administration fees, utilize the benefits of the CORSA website, and have a vote in CORSA business, but have no desire to receive a Communique. Tier 2 members will opt to receive an e-communique, instead of a printed issue, at a lesser fee than tier 3, with all the normal CORSA benefits, and Tier 3 members will receive a printed Communique and all the benefits they do presently.

This three tiered membership concept could eliminate the chapters filing fee, and help non-CORSA members become members. Chapters could add the minimal tier 1 dues onto the chapter's dues of their non-CORSA members, as a service fee. The member will automatically become a tier 1 member and receive the extra CORSA benefits. Or they could use the money slated for the chapter filing fee and some discretionary money, to sign up a few, or all their non-CORSA members.

To add greater value to all membership tiers, the CORSA website is being redesigned, and additional services are being added, namely a Corvair Wikipedia section and the Commscan Project. The Commscan project is a group of individuals dedicated to scan and create electronic PDF files of all CORSA publications from the last 40 years. It will include a word searchable index so members can find specific articles, or they may choose to use the files for just plain reading enjoyment. The Commscan project will take a considerable amount of time to complete, but will be well worth the wait. The Wiki will be available soon on the CORSA website for members to start downloading information into. Both projects will more than likely be placed behind the membership benefits area of the website, and only available to CORSA members. There will also be selected excerpts of each, on the public portion of the website, to act as a promotional tool and demonstrate the value of CORSA membership.

Because of the additional content, and the change in behavior of society to use more and more electronic communication, the CORSA website will become the most important piece for future communication and recruitment. Each piece of this plan creates a section of a large circle that will continue to link us together for many years, even if familiar services like the printed Communique or the International Convention cease to exist.

This plan includes changes, but they are needed to sustain CORSA. I have always been leery of change, but not afraid of it. Are you?

If you find this idea promising, I suggest contacting your CORSA directors and officers and making them aware of your position on this proposal.








