# Late Model Clutch Removal and Replacement

My 1965 Monza Coupe started as a 140HP with a 4 speed in California. The previous owner decided he wanted a Corsa Clone, so he changed the dash and emblems to reflect that. Somewhere along the line he decided the secondary carbs were too much trouble, and he removed them, and blanked the manifolds with aluminum plates.

I was having problems tuning the primary carbs and finally had Andy Clark give me a mini lesson on making that work. Despite Andy's best efforts, those carbs still did not function properly. So I finally found a set of four used carbs, pulled them apart, and reset them to specs. I bent new fuel lines and installed all four carbs and the tuning was done in about five minutes. It really is easy when the carbs are in good shape. See Figure 1.

The engine responded so well on the test drive that I noticed the clutch was slipping when cruising about 35 mph in fourth, and accelerating. I thought it was slipping before this, but now I was sure.

That started the next project, ordering parts and planning the replacement of the flywheel, pressure plate, and clutch. Ron Zentner was very helpful on this project with information as well as several devices that made the work go quickly and safely. See Figure 2 and 3. He also helped in the disassembly.


Figure 6 - Old clutch disc and pressure plate showing the worn hot spots on the face.

Taking everything apart to get ready to lower the drive train went quickly with the help of Ron and my brother Gordy. See Figure 4. As soon as the clutch and the faces of the flywheel and pressure plate were exposed I knew that we did the right thing to order all three in advance. See Figure 5 and 6. I spend the next couple of days cleaning everything, and getting ready for the assembly. My brother showed up to help with that last phase and everything went back together without problems in about 4 hours.

I have to say, the turnbuckles holding the wheels in place made the job of replacing the suspension and rear axles very easy. The clutch adjustment was way out, probably from being adjusted to compensate for the warn clutch.

The shop manuals do provide the correct procedures, and everything went well when we followed the instructions. So, with shop manuals, advice and help from friends in North Cascades Corvairs, and a willing brother, the job was completed successfully.

# **NCC Tech Tip**

One in an occasional series of member provided suggestions to help increase the performance, reliability or enjoyment of our Corvairs. Thanks to Vic Kukrall for this month's tip.

*Editors note:* Anecdotal evidence exists that this modification does increase performance. Be aware however that it is also reported to shorten plug life.



# SIDE-GAP PLUGS

One of the advantages to side-gap spark plugs is that they run cleaner at low rpm. Many manufacturers offer these plugs (in limited heat ranges). If you desire such a plug for your race or street machine, it's a cinch to modify standard plugs to the side-gap configuration. Starting with a conventional lug of the heat range you normally use, carefully bend the ground electrode back away from the center electrode. Carefully grind or file the tip of the ground electrode a sufficient amount so that it will end up in the center of the center electrode, as shown. Be careful not to damage the center electrode or the porcelain while doing your filing or grinding.

### **Plug Electrode Modification**

Opening the plug gap to  $1\frac{1}{2}$  times normal gap doubles the power (spark Energy) to the plug.

### **Optional**

Cut the overhead electrode back far enough so that it no longer covers the center electrode. File off burrs, open gap to  $1\frac{1}{2}$  times normal, measured between the two closest surfaces.

# Vairious Thoughts (continued)




